TOURING THE YARD

Welcome! Great moments and heroes in American history are represented throughout the Yard in statues, paintings, ship models and artifacts. The Naval Academy is accessible through the Gate 1 pedestrian entrances on Randall Street and Prince George Street. Visitors 18 and older must show a photo ID. Once on the Yard, please proceed to the right to enter the Quarterdeck upon exiting security, continue along to the Visitor Center and Gift Shop!

- 1 Armel-Leftwich Visitor Center & Gift Shop**
Visitors to the Naval Academy are welcomed as they enter the Halsey Field House on the way to the Armel-Leftwich Visitor Center. Exhibits include: photos and interactive videos of academy life; a USNA Featured Graduates display; and an Alumni Association directory. The Visitor Center houses an information desk, introductory film, the Naval Academy Guide Service for tours, the official Naval Academy Gift Shop and additional exhibits.
- 2 Admissions**
Open to the public and potential candidates interested in applying to the Naval Academy. Briefings are hosted Monday - Saturday at 10 a.m. and 2 p.m. except during Federal Holidays.
- 3 Ricketts Hall, NAAA Ticket Office, Terwilliger Center for Student Athletes**
Tickets for Navy athletic events are sold here.
- 4 Lejeune Physical Education Center**
The Athletic Hall of Fame, an Olympic-size pool and a wrestling arena are located here.
- 5 The Commodore Uriah P. Levy Center and Jewish Chapel**
Supports the moral development of midshipmen, provides a fellowship hall and a reflection space for the Brigade. 2nd deck open to the public.
- 6 Dahlgren Hall**
The Drydock Restaurant offers a quick service restaurant open to the public (Expected in 2024). Hanging above the second deck you will find a model of the historic Wright Brothers B-1 Flyer.
- 7 T-Court**
The Indian Chief Tamanend stands watch over the site of noon meal formations for the Brigade of Midshipmen, normally held at 12:00 pm weekdays (except Wednesdays) during the academic year, schedule and weather permitting.
- 8 Bancroft Hall**
Bancroft Hall is the largest dormitory in the U.S. The Rotunda and sample midshipman room are open to the public.

- 9 Main Chapel**
The Chapel was dedicated in 1908 and conducts Catholic and Protestant services which are open to the public.

Crypt of John Paul Jones
One of the greatest Revolutionary War naval heroes, Jones is enshrined beneath the Chapel.
- 10 U.S. Naval Academy Museum, Preble Hall**
The museum contains historic treasures, paintings and artifacts. Open daily (except Tuesday).
- 11 1845 Coffee Shop**
Located in one of the oldest buildings on the Naval Academy Yard, the historic Gate 3 Gatehouse, 1845 Coffee proudly serves specialty espresso, Kombucha, various waters, and juices. 1845 Coffee also features fresh baked goods and various Naval Academy merchandise.
- 12 The Alley at The Naval Academy**
Nestled in the historic lower level of the Naval Academy club, the Alley serves delicious and affordable lunch for the public. Open to members only in the evening, we welcome visitors during lunch to experience the local, fresh dishes created by our executive culinary team.
